

Positives for older South Australians



26% health funding



17% energy subsidies / concessions



9% housing / stamp duty measures



7% cost of living support

"Given current circumstances I think it was a fair budget & well targeted. Not a good time for 'cash splashes' & really, the issues are systemic & structural."

"Funding for skilled workers and cost of living pressures for pensioners."

"Not really much for older people except maybe some improvement with health and hospitals."

What was missed or likely to negatively impact older South Australians



34% further cost of living support, pricing controls



13% more health support e.g., free ambulance, GPs



12% stronger action on housing/rentals



8% more service funding for regional SA



6% cost of living relief for non-concession holders

"Not really happy with the cost of living help because it only covers electricity and nothing to help with petrol, food, license or registration costs. The stamp duty assistance is not going to do anything for older South Australians."

However...

43% very little / nothing positive for them or older South Australians



6% unsure

13% felt older people / self-funded retirees generally missed out

Other issues raised included: public transport, cost of council rates, climate change and aged care services
